REPORT OF WOMEN CELL 2023-2024

Women Cell 2023-2024 of MES College Marampally conducted various activities for the female and male students which are relevant in the present scenario. The activities of the Cell were categorized into three groups viz. training wing, cultural wing and community intervention wing. Cell conducted regular meetings in which the problems, issues, and challenges faced by the girls were discussed, and remedial measures were taken from time to time.

Women cell representatives from each class were selected in the first week of July 2023. A meeting of these selected members was conducted on 12th July 2023. Ms. Final Rosna Subair of I MSc Electronics was elected as the student coordinator and Ms. Farsana Shameer of II BSc Psychology was selected as the joint coordinator. Ms. Ashna Abbas of II MSc Electronics and Ms. Sweatha of II BSc Psychology were the coordinators of the programmes under the training wing. Ms. Abhirami of II BSc Biotechnology and Ms. Mayoogha of II MSc Computer Science were in charge of cultural activities. Fathima Nazrin of II BSc Electronics and Supreetha of I BSc Microbiology coordinated the community intervention programmes.

A proposal was submitted to Kerala State Women Development Corporation (KSWDC) in July by the staff coordinator Ms. Sheeba Varghese and KSWDC approved the same. An amount of Rs.25000/- was sanctioned by KSWDC for the activities of the Women Cell during the academic year 2023-2024. A detailed activity report is given below.




2. WORKSHOP ON HOOP ART EMBROIDERY






4. TALK ON 'A LEGAL PERSPECTIVE OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN'


5. TALK ON LAWS ON PROTECTION OF WOMEN






8. SEMINAR ON EMPOWERMENT THROUGH EDUCATION: TACKLING SEXUAL ABUSE










9. TALK ON UNLOCKING POTENTIAL: CULTIVATING CHARACTER






13. RELEASE OF MANUSCRIPT "PUNARJANI."


