






Curriculum content is relevant and need based 610 responses




Curriculum fosters entrepreneurship/ skill development/higher learning 610 responses


Syllabus inculcate ethical values 610 responses










Alumni feedback has three main objectives:



Course content is relevant, up to date and cater to the requirements of the job 496 responses






Curriculum ensures professional development 496 responses

Sufficient reference books are available in the library
















Curriculum is appropriate and need based 139 responses








58.3% of the teachers agree that the Instructional hours are adequate, 34.5% strongly agree, 5.8% have disagree and 1.4% Undecided with the statement.






Infrastructure, laboratory and library facilities are adequate 139 responses

Good balance between theory and application/practical exists 139 responses





Action Taken Report

Form a task force to assess and update the curriculum. Initiate a comprehensive review of the syllabus to incorporate industry-relevant topics and practical applications, ensuring it reflects current trends and includes practical illustrations where applicable. Additionally, increase the practical components within the curriculum to provide students with hands-on experience that aligns with industry expectations. Inform the corresponding Board of Studies (BOS) at MG University about these initiatives.

We have explored the feasibility of introducing add-on courses that complement the existing curriculum and cater to specialized interests or emerging industry needs.

Conducted a time-management workshop for faculty to optimize instructional hours effectively. Reviewed the teaching plan and adjusted where necessary.









Curriculum has relevance to industrial needs/employment 52 responses






50% of the employers strongly agree that the Curriculum ensures professional development, 48.1% agree and 1.9% disagree with the statement.


The curriculum promotes team work 52 responses

The curriculum promotes innovation ecosystem



51.9% of the employers agree that the curriculum promotes team work, 48.1% strongly agree with the statement.



Syllabus has good balance between theory and practical/application



Action Taken Report

Skill-boosting modules are being added alongside regular courses, emphasizing practical and psychology-related content.

Organized industry-specific placement drives and job fairs. Invited HR professionals and recruiters to interact with students through seminars and workshops. Enhanced the placement preparation program with mock interviews, resume writing workshops, and industry-specific training. Encouraged students to participate in live projects and internships during their course of study. Formalized the internship program to ensure all students gain diverse industry experience. Initiatives include industry connections to bridge academia and corporate practices. Increased student participation in placement drives and seminars on modern tools ensures comprehensive preparedness for the professional landscape. These actions aim to harmonize theoretical knowledge with practical skills for students.
