
#### **BECOMING A PROFESSIONAL**





# HIGHER STUDIES AFTER GRADUATION FOR ELECTRONICS AND COMPUTER APPLICATION STUDENTS




# ASSOCIATED FOR ACADEMIA INTERNATIONAL STUDENT EXCHANGE PROGRAM PARTNERSHIP
