MES College Marampally offers a diverse array of academic

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programs to meet students' educational goals. We provide 17 Undergraduate programs (UG), 9 Postgraduate programs (PG), 1 Integrated programme and 2 Research programs. The UG programs span various fields, including 7 Vocational programs for practical skills, 3 in Commerce and Management, 5 in Science, and 2 in Arts/Literature. All UG programs except, BVoc follow the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS). During their fifth semester, UG students can choose open courses from diverse disciplines, enhancing their educational experience. The PG programs follow the Credit and Semester System, with elective courses available in the third and fourth semesters. B. Voc programs offer flexibility with multiple entry and exit points. Students engage in mini projects and internships alongside their regular coursework. The institution provides a range of add-on programs to equip students for the job market. The institution promotes online learning through platforms like SWAYAM, Coursera, and Spoken Tutorial. As a local NPTEL chapter, the institution encourages students to explore these resources. MES College Marampally is dedicated to delivering a holistic and dynamic education, preparing our students for the challenges and opportunities of the modern world.

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

MES College Marampally currently operates as an affiliated PG college under the jurisdiction of the affiliating university and Department of Higher Education, Govt of Kerala. As of now, MES College Marampally is not eligible to register for the Academic Bank of Credits. Our eligibility for participation depends on the guidelines set by the affiliating university and the Higher Education Department in Kerala State. Despite our current ineligibility, we actively encourage our students to enroll in online Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs) and programs offered by reputable platforms such as NPTEL, Spoken Tutorial, Coursera, etc. This initiative aims to enrich their learning experiences. Our dedicated faculty members contribute to the teaching and learning process by creating educational content. This content is made available to students through our college's YouTube channel. MES College Marampally boasts a well-equipped studio for recording classes, ensuring a high-quality learning experience for our students. The Department of Industrial Instrumentation and Automation has developed a cutting-edge light board, which facilitates recording of classes. This innovation enhances our teaching methods and content delivery. While we may not currently participate in Academic Bank of Credits, we remain committed to providing our students with the best possible education through

innovative and accessible means.

17.Skill development:

MES College Marampally is committed to fostering a comprehensive learning environment that empowers students with practical skills, personal development, and effective communication. Institutions runs 7 BVoc programmes to promote skill enhanced learning. Our initiatives and programs encompass: The institution organizes events, including seminars, workshops, and certificate courses, aimed at enhancing students' vocational skills and personal growth. Emphasizing student-centric education, we promote experiential learning, participatory activities, and problem-solving. Various student clubs foster peer-to-peer learning, bringing together like-minded individuals. These clubs offer platforms for students to collaborate, share knowledge, and collectively develop their skills. The institution actively encourages student participation in government-sponsored skill development programs like ASAP (Additional Skill Acquisition Programme). Our ASAP center has earned an esteemed four-star rating. Through partnerships such as the YIP program and Sector Skill Council certifications, we offer a broad spectrum of services, including consultancy projects like water quality analysis, website development, stitching, and electronic equipment servicing. Institution conducts regular value-added certificate programs, equipping students with additional skills. IEDC offers skill development programs enabling students to earn while learning, fostering entrepreneurship and self-reliance. Our unwavering commitment is to nurture well-rounded individuals. We students not only with practical skills but also with effective communication abilities,

18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

As the college is affiliated, its ability to incorporate various elements into the curriculum is limited. Nevertheless, the college has made significant efforts to integrate the Indian knowledge system into both academic and extracurricular activities. Students are exposed to a range of subjects encompassing Indian history, culture, literature, heritage, patriotism, nationalism, and aesthetics through core, common, and supplementary courses in various programmes. These courses include topics like English Literature from the Old English Period to the Romantic Age, Postcolonial Literatures, Indian English Literature, Culture Studies, Literature of the Nineteenth Century, Indian Poetic Tradition, Dalit Studies, and Gender

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Studies. Furthermore, various departments and cells/clubs within the college organize special events on important occasions. For instance, the campus celebrates Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav with a total of seventy-five diverse programs. Additionally, different departments host programs in commemoration of Mahatma Gandhi's 150th birth anniversary. The NSS/NCC also observes Constitution Day, Republic Day, and Independence Day annually. Moreover, students have the opportunity to enroll in online courses related to the Indian Knowledge System through Swayam NPTEL.

To help students reach their full potential, our departments offer additional certificate programs. These programs align with the program outcomes and Program Specific Outcomes, giving students the freedom to choose courses that match their interests and goals.

20.Distance education/online education:

In the ever-evolving landscape of education, technology-driven learning is taking center stage. While we are an affiliated college with certain limitations on offering distance education, we wholeheartedly embrace and encourage the use of online resources and platforms for both our faculty and students. Our college proudly hosts a local chapter of NPTEL, demonstrating our commitment to providing our students and faculty with access to an array of enriching courses. Our Computer Applications department has forged partnerships with IIT Mumbai to offer Spoken Tutorial programs, further enhancing the learning

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experience. Our dedicated faculty members utilize a variety of advanced tools and systems, including MOODLE, Google Classroom, Edmodo, and popular communication apps like Zoom and Google Meet, to ensure continuous engagement and interaction with our students. To facilitate the learning process, we furnish students with teaching materials in various formats, including PDFs, audio and video recordings, and PowerPoint presentations. Our campus boasts a Network Resource Centre, an E-content studio floor, a mini theater, a 3D lab, smart boards, Wi-Fi access, DELNET subscription, and UGC N-LIST subscription. Our library provides dedicated login credentials for students and faculty, making it convenient to access e-resources remotely.

2.5 - Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1 - Mechanism of internal assessment is transparent and robust in terms of frequency and mode. Write description within 200 words.

The institution's head appoints an internal examination coordinator for both undergraduate (UG) and postgraduate (PG) courses. Extensive meetings are held, both online and offline, to deliberate on the examination procedures. To ensure transparency, CCTV cameras are installed in all classrooms during the examination period.

Following a format akin to the university model, the college administers one internal exam and one model exam. The timetable is collected from all departments and prominently displayed on the notice board. The updated class list is also made public.

After the completion of exams, the internal desk gathers the answer sheets and attendance lists, which bear the signatures of both students and invigilators. A specified date is announcedfor collecting mark sheets from all departments. If a student misses the exam due to a valid reason, they are given an opportunity for a makeup exam.

A comprehensive analysis of the collected marksheets is prepared and submitted to the Principal and IQAC co-ordinator. The results of the internal assessment are communicated to parents during the Parents Teachers Meeting.

Should any grievances arise, students have the option to report them to their Tutor, Grievance Redressal Cell of the college, or directly to the Principal for further clarification.

2.5.2 - Mechanism to deal with internal examination related grievances is transparent, time-bound and efficient

The college's internal exams are characterized by transparency and adherence to schedules. The internal exam format closely resembles that of university exams. In the interest of fairness and transparency, students receive their graded answer scripts. Only after students are satisfied with the evaluation process, they endorse their respective scores.

The results of internal assessments are shared with parents during Parent-Teacher Meetings. Any grievances stemming from the conduct or process of internal exams are handled with utmost care and confidentiality. There is a structured approach to addressing these issues, starting with the class tutor, who escalates the matter to the Head of the Departmentif necessary.

The next level in the hierarchy is the institution's leader, the Principal. Grievances are documented in the college's grievance cell, and students have the option to submit their complaints in the grievance cell's complaint box.

This grievance redressal mechanism operates at three tiers: the Department level, the College level, and the University level. Grievances related to university exams, such as withheld results, widespread failures, non-receipt of mark sheets, and similar concerns, are conveyed through the Principal to the Controller of Examinations at MG University.

Academic projects and vivas are integral components of the university syllabus across various programs, while internships are part of the curriculum for many programs. Every semester, two internal examinations are held in accordance with the University's examination pattern, and the results are disclosed within a week. Tutors prepare internal grade sheets, and internal grades, as well as attendance records, are regularly updated on the college website at tcs.mesmarampally.org. Students and parents can access the necessary information via login access on the college website.

Upon finalizing the internal marks, students endorse them, and the Grading and Restructuring Coordinator subsequently uploads the internal grades onto the University system.

4.2 - Library as a Learning Resource

The central library of MES College spans over an area of 803.6 sq. m across two floors in a verdure providing a reader-friendly ambience for teaching, learning and research activities.

The library is fully automated with ILMS software KOHA (Version 3.22.06.000), WEB OPAC and online renewal facility. The users can utilise over 20017 books of 14000 titles in varying subjects, 66 print journals and over 100000 e-resources. Wide repository of periodicals, previous year question papers and a collection of rare books are also available. The NLIST database subscription and the Digital Library (Tech Focuz) enables users to access e -resources (Kindle), thesies and dissertations.

The library provides a reference section, New Arrivals section, a reading room with a seating capacity of 120 students and a network resource centre facility with 30 nodes and 25 computers. The Wi-Fi-enabled library has a number of audio book cassettes, Non-Visual Desktop Access, Kibo scanner and KiboXS for visually disabled students, Turnitin plagiarism checker, surveillance cameras and barcoding scanners.

Library management system organize seminars, workshops, orientation sessions and training to BLISc and MLISc students of neighbouring institutions every academic year. Awards for best library user to promote reading culture.

4.3 - IT Infrastructure

The academic year 2022-23 witnessed significant enhancements and upgrades to IT facilities. These improvements include 392 computer systems,68 LCD-equipped classrooms and 4 ICT enabled seminar halls. To facilitate advanced learning 8 Intellectual Interactive Panels were introduced.

The College is equipped with 19 UPS units and three generator ensuring uninterrupted power supply. The entire campus enjoys WiFi coverage to support the newly expanded infrastructure.

The Examination Control room has been outfitted with essential resources, including high-speed internet, a duplex printer, Digital Duplicator (RISO) and a photocopier with camera surveillance capabilities, all of which are crucial for managing university examinations.

The College community actively utilizes platforms such as Coursera, NPTELand spoken tutorials for both learning and teaching purposes. To maintain academic integrity, Turnitin software is employed to monitor and uphold ethical standards in research studies conducted by students and faculty members.

To enhance student data management, an ERP software called Linways has been implemented. A robust internet connection is ensured by providing fully structured Optical Fiber connectivity at speeds of 460MBPS.

Campus security is prioritized through the deployment of security cameras, serving as both a visual deterrent and a means to ensure students' safety while on campus.

4.4.2 - There are established systems and procedures for maintaining and utilizing physical, academic and support facilities - laboratory, library, sports complex, computers, classrooms etc.

Our institution has implemented various measures to ensure efficient infrastructure maintenance and utilization. In collaboration with the College Planning Forum, a dedicated subcommittee oversees infrastructure maintenance. Rules for laboratories and the library are available on the college website.

A supervisor and staff maintain campus cleanliness and security. Lab assistants handle equipment checks and maintenance. Annual maintenance contracts ensure equipment functionality and that sensitive equipment has backup power. Laboratories are maximized for student projects, workshops, and vocational training.

A network resource centre provides reprography and internet access, managed by a network administrator. IT resources are backed up with UPS and generators, and solar panels support computer labs. Faculty and students design brochures, banners, and newsletters.

We have an SLR camera for documenting events, and IT resources to support film screening. The Electronics Department developed a teaching app, and students run "MES Rhythms Radio."

Our library is fully automated with efficient access and annual stock reviews. We promote healthy living with a health club and maintain sports amenities. The college playground hosts various championships, and we offer local school students yoga and martial arts training.

Our auditorium, seminar, and conference hall are used for academic and cultural programs. Special committees ensure efficient canteen, bus, and hostel operations. Amenities like water purification plants, sanitary pad vending machines, and incinerators are regularly serviced, with solid waste disposal

managed through biogas plants.

These measures enhance our institution's well-maintained infrastructure, improving the educational experience for students and faculty.

Student Evaluation on teachers: IQAC utilizes automated assessment tools to evaluate student performance. Subsequently, the Principal reviews the evaluation report and communicates the findings with the respective teacher.

Self-Appraisal Form for teachers: Teachers annually fill out a Self-Appraisal Form encompassing curricular, co-curricular, extracurricular activities, and research. The Principal, IQAC, and Management conduct regular performance reviews.

Monthly Report: The Departments compile a monthly report detailing departmental activities, individual teacher contributions, and achievements of students and faculty. The principal consistently reviews this comprehensive report.

Academic Monitoring System: Principal ensures syllabus completion using the academic monitoring system which is verified by the Heads of the Departments.

Core Monitoring Committee Teacher Profile: At the end of the academic year, the Core Monitoring Committee, under IQAC, reviews the Teacher Profile prepared by faculty. The Committee provides suggestions to improve quality during CMC visits to each

department.

Management Review Regular staff and department meetings, along with annual performance interviews for Self-Financing staff, are conducted by the Management.

Self-Appraisal for non-teaching staff: Self-appraisal forms of Non-teaching staff are collected through which the Principal reviews their performance.

The institution has a transparent financial management system in place, with funds primarily sourced from the Government and Management. External and internal audits are conducted separately for both Government and Management accounts.

Funds sanctioned by the Government/UGC are audited at three levels:

Chartered Accountant- Government/UGC grants and funds are periodically audited by an external Chartered Accountant. All ratified accounts, together with the audit report, are forwarded to the authority sanctioning the fund.

Directorate of Collegiate Education- During its annual audit, the Directorate of Collegiate Education verifies public funds utilized by the college.

Accountant General, Kerala - The AG, Kerala also verifies all government-sanctioned accounts periodically. The funds are further utilized based on their suggestions and directions.

Financial Audits of grants and funds sanctioned by Management

The institution has a strong advisory board for financial matters. All sanctioned accounts are audited both internally and externally. The Treasurer, MES Central Committee, Calicut, performs the internal audit of management accounts. If necessary, the college's financial advisor makes corrections under his direction.

The Management has appointed M A Moideen and Associates to audit the Management accounts. Annual financial statements and audit reports are prepared at the end of every financial year.

1. Research Development

A recent milestone in research and development has been the inauguration of the second research centre in Computer Science and Allied areas of Electronics with Research Centre in Biotechnology being the first. The institution envisions continued growth and impact, supported by the IQAC and Research Promotion Council, strengthening interdisciplinary research activities. Highlights include:

- 23 research papers were presented and 51 book chapters were published in academic year 22-23.
- FDP on "Identifying Quality Journals for Publishing your Articles" for the faculty members and a talk on "Effective Cues to Research Paper Writing" for students were organised.
- Organized one-day intercollegiate paper presentation competition "EXEMPLAR23". A total of 50 papers were presented from about 20 colleges.

2. Startups and Metavalley TBI

METAValleyTechnology Business Incubator (TBI) embarked on its journey in March 2023 with the aim of fostering entrepreneurship and supporting the growth of startups. The TBI was initiated through the establishment of an Innovation and Entrepreneurship Development Center (IEDC) under the guidance of the Kerala Startup Mission with support from college IQAC. Since then, METAVALLEY TBI has evolved to elevate the entrepreneurial spirit within the student community and transform innovative ideas into marketable products and is running successfully with 26startups.

This structure likely involves various levels or committees responsible for assessing quality assurance. Each semester, IQAC collects academic audits and teacher feedback.

Academic audit: In a comprehensive process, the institution reviews its teaching-learning process on a regular basis at three distinct levels- institutional, departmental, and faculty member/tutor-with IQAC coordinating the entire process.

Institution Level: Every year, staff coordinators for various academic bodies are selected through rotation. A detailed Academic Schedule is developed based on annual review and report submitted by IQAC's

Department Level: Each department prepares an Action Plan for the year based on IQAC guidelines. Every month, the department heads report the progress to the staff council.

Faculty/Tutor Level: Each faculty member develops teaching plan, teaching schedule, and monthly reports. Student learning outcomes are evaluated at the teacher level. Tutors hold PTA meetings to discuss students' progress.

Core Monitoring Committee audit: At the end of every academic year, CMC evaluates the performance of each department. It emphasizes innovations in teaching, learning, and examination reforms. Based on the assessments, CMC makes recommendations.

Solid Waste Management: Practices for Paperless office via Linways Academic Management System have been in place at the institutional level. Public addressing system & LCD displays are used to convey important information and events promotion. Good practices are followed by usage of paper flex for seminars and conferences. Separate bins are placed at various points to collect food and other waste. College canteen is equipped with Biogas plants. Biodegradable waste materials are processed by using Vermicompost unit in the campus.

Liquid Waste Management: The effluents from toilets and laboratories are collected in the separate septic pits and allowed to settle in to the soil. Laboratory liquid chemical waste are collected and safely disposed after proper neutralization. Microbiologically contaminated liquid wastes are expelled after proper decontamination process.

Biomedical Waste Management: Biomedical Wastes as Sanitary Napkins are managed by four incinerators installed.

E-Waste Management: Periodic checks and proper upgradation and maintenance are in place for electronic equipments. E- Waste drives are organized to safely collect and dispose them, in partnership with NGO and local authority.

Waste Recycling System: There is a Water Recycling Plant that recycles 20,000 litres per day and is used in toilets.

- Playground with a gallery, Cricket Practicing nets, Netball Court, Kabaddi Court, Skating rink and Indoor Stadium
- Reach out to local schools with economically disadvantaged students and offer academic and financial assistance.
- Organize programs to raise awareness about gender issues, climate change and social concerns such as literacy, health, hygiene, sanitation andsafe drinking water.
